

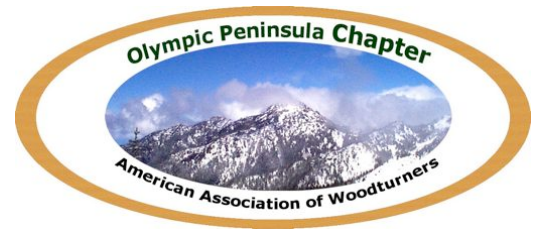

Lathe features: 1 1/4 inch-8TPI spindle, No. 2 Morse Tapers, Tapered Roller Bearings, hollow tailstock, cast iron bed, 24 position indexing. It comes with 6 inch faceplate, revolving center, 4-prong drive center, wrench 12 inch toolrest and 5 1/2 inch handwheel. Picture below. Price \$1,900.00.

Current price is \$2,595.00 plus freight collect. I don't remember how much I paid for freight, but it was not "cheap". With fuel surcharges, etc. I imagine freight is out of sight. My lathe is like new and I have less than 25 hours turning time. I have been very careful the few times I worked with the lathe to not have solvents "all-over" the lathe. 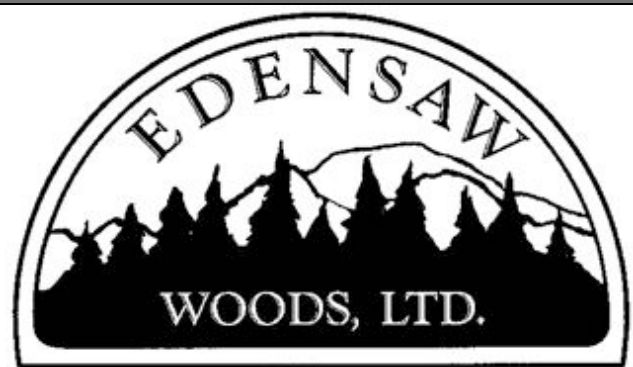
